

## What do voters in Northern Ireland think about the Protocol on Ireland/Northern Ireland?

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- 4 The poll attracted comments from 598 of the 3009 respondents to the poll. Of the comments, 68 related exclusively to the survey structure and 530 related to the survey topic. These comments inevitably include those from respondents who were not part of the weighted data sample of 1516, but they are nonetheless of interest in our quest to 'temperature test' NI public opinion. We have analysed these comments and categorised them using systematic qualitative data coding across all four polls. The following provides a summary of the themes addressed by the qualitative comments received in the open-text part of the survey:

- 5 Figures reflect the percentage of respondents identifying each issue from most important (1) to least import (10), e.g. 32% of respondents rank the future of the NHS as their top concern; 20% of respondents rank the effects of the Protocol as the issue of least concern.
- 6 Where there has been a growth in trust and/or a decrease in distrust since the June 2021 poll that is above the margin of error (i.e. at 3% or more), these figures are marked in blue. Excludes Don't Knows/Not sure/No opinion/Neutral (0% for all, except 2% for UUP and 3% for business representatives).
